



Our Climate Change Forest

Children at Awbridge Primary have focussed on the environmental issues of deforestation and plastics in our seas and oceans. Children from Year R to Year 6 all participated in producing the artwork for this project. Year R painted leaves using acrylics. Years 1 and 2 used collage techniques, layering tissue papers with pva glue to create flame and wave effects. Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 sketched and painted rainforest animals and sea creatures using combinations of watercolour and acrylic paints. As part of their poetry unit, Year 6 children have written some evocative poems highlighting the polluting aspects of plastics in the seas and oceans.



Some thoughts from children at Awbridge:

"There are many leaves in the forest so we painted some leaves. To make the leaf I used a paintbrush to add dark green and brown paint. I put yellow dots around with my finger." Rupert (YR)

"I think people should stop putting rubbish in the sea. Rubbish should go in the bin or be recycled." Ivor (Y1)

"I am worried about losing the rainforests and the monkeys having no home. I have been to the rainforest and I know how special it is." Bibi (Y2)

"I think it's sad that animals' homes are being destroyed in order to make palm oil. I hope they stop the destruction because animals such as the orangutang are so human-like. It is a tragedy to see them suffer."

Ava (Y3)

"I painted a piranha and a jellyfish. I am worried about the ocean heating up from global warming. It's not very good. If I could ask an oceanographer a question it would be 'How does the ocean absorb heat?'. With the poles heating up, other animals such as the arctic fox and polar bear are struggling." Henry (Y4)

"I painted an orangutang sat in a tree. My slogan said "I don't matter". I don't think we will be able to stop people destroying the forests. I just hope it will become more sustainable, such as planting trees for palm oil around the edges of rainforest rather than destroying the whole habitat." Samuel (Y5)

"Our teacher showed us a video of how plastics are destroying the ocean habitats. I think we should be making less things out of plastic and using cardboard more. I hope that less plastic will be in the oceans in the future so that our planet and marine life can stay healthy." Scarlett (Y6)
