Following on from the successful Our Climate Change Forest project 2020-21 you are invited to participate in the continuation project to address a range of perspectives on the climate issue facing us all and providing an opportunity for those perspectives to be expressed through the medium of Art.

This project will also be promoting community cohesion across the county by providing a number of different public spaces to include inside and outdoor venues to share those varied and diverse perspectives.

It will provide an additional platform for marginalized communities to have their voices heard. These could include: CYP across our communities (school and non-school based), Minority ethnic communities, Faith communities, LGBTQ+ groups, Disabled and SEND communities, The Elderly (Men in Sheds, craft groups).

The project will be disseminated across a variety of online forums (The moodle (https://hias-moodle.mylearningapp.com (Art, RADE and RE platforms), websites, e-bulletins) and provide an opportunity to celebrate, share and ultimately develop climate education and inclusion education across Hampshire school communities whilst making wider curricular links.

To capture and share schools voices and initial thinking about Climate unity we are planning a series of installations across the County next summer 2022.

Artwork will comprise of circular work using recycled materials to be symbolic of the planet and ideas about eternity and inclusion.

QR codes can be used to communicate this thinking to visitors. A separate piece of bunting, for each venue that work is submitted to, will also be required to contain pupil voice. It is envisaged that the circles will contain thinking about inclusion and the preservation of our planet at this time.
